





Robert Hiller and Stephen Solender have all made tremendous contributions that have helped us to become the vibrant, active federation we are today. But their reach extends well beyond our community, all have transcended our Baltimore boundaries to profoundly impact Jewish life around the world. We dedicate this page to all our leaders past and present, but especially to a man who served us for nearly four decades—Harry Greenstein.

Often described as selfless and gentle, compassionate and considerate, Harry Greenstein believed strongly that Judaism is a religion of action and social justice, and he brought those behefs to life. He was executive director of THE ASSOCIATED from 1928 to 1965, and Jewish Communal Service Association president in 1937-38. During his many years of service to the Jewish and general communities, he built a foundation for public social welfare work in Maryland.

Harry Greenstein is recognized as one of the outstanding figures of his day in social work. We will always remember him as a far-seeing, courageous and warmly sympathetic man—endowed with the great gifts of patience, persistence and understanding.

We honor Bert today for his lifelong devotion to the highest Jewish values and his decades of distinguished service to the Jewish community.




